Private letters of Dame Enid Russell-Smith sent to her family in the form of a daily diary. Correspondence between Dame Enid Russell-Smith and fellow members of the Durham County Conservation Trust during her time as chairman. Notes for speeches made following her arrival at Durham.

Dame Enid Russell-Smith

Dame Enid Mary Russell-Smith (1903-1989) was born in Esher, Surrey on 3 March 1903. She was educated at St Felix School, Southwold and Newnham College, Cambridge. She began her career in the Civil Service in 1925 as assistant principal and was one of the first three women to enter the service through open competition. Dame Enid spent most of her civil service career in the Ministry of Health, occupying the position of assistant secretary in 1939 and under-secretary in 1946, finally rising to the position of deputy secretary in 1957. Her work included the co-ordination of provision for evacuees during WWII and she helped to introduce the National Health Service following the war. Following her retirement from the civil service, Dame Enid served as Principal of St Aidan's College, University of Durham (1963-1970) and lectured part-time in the politics department until 1986. During this time she was involved with various voluntary organisations such as the Durham County Conservation Trust and St Paul's Jarrow Development Trust. Dame Enid was a key figure in women's judo and achived the level of Shodan in 1945.

(i) Personal Correspondence

Letters from Dame Enid Russell Smith to her family describing her life as Principal of St. Aidan's College, Durham University. The letters take the form of a daily diary, covering both her professional and private life in Durham, and her travels throughout the country and abroad. They were circulated among members of her family and later returned to her. Several themes are common throughout: the day-to-day life of the college, her social life including trips to the theatre and entertaining, comments on the weather, regular trips to sites of interest in Durham and Yorkshire with students, Dame Enid's views on education, and her love of gardening, walking and bird watching. Other subjects covered are itemised below. The letters have been arranged chronologically in files, each file covering one calendar year.
