Contents

Letters from Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson, president of the English College in Lisbon, and others, mostly covering Russell's time as bishop of Portalegre and, later, bishop of Vizéu. The letters shed light on various aspects of college life during the late-seventeenth century, notably its financial administration, teaching, and student intake, as well as various controversies including accusations of Blacklowism within the college. Russell's prominent role within the Portuguese church is also represented in the correspondence, evident in discussions of episcopal visitations, various disputes over jurisdiction with the clergy, relations with the Syon nuns, and other internal affairs. Finally, the letters reveal Russell's connections with notable Portuguese families and recusant English Catholic gentry (including the Dukes of Norfolk and the Earls of Derwentwater), with the latter in particular ensuring that Russell was particularly well informed of the rise in anti-Catholicism and the renewed threat of persecution of the Catholics in England following the uncovering of the Popish Plot in 1678.

About the creator

Richard Russell was born in Berkshire in 1630. When he was just twelve years old, he became servant to Dr. Edward Daniel, newly appointed President of Lisbon College. Five years later he was admitted as an alumnus to the college but was ordained in Douai College in 1653. Following a brief spell as procurator at Lisbon College, he was summoned back to England by the Chapter in 1657, where he spent three years as a chaplain to the Portuguese ambassador. On his return to Portugal he received the title of Secretary to the Queen, and a pension, in consideration of his services to the crown of Portugal. He played a leading role in the marriage treaty of Charles II and Catherine of Braganza and was elected a canon of the English Chapter in 1661. In 1671, he was appointed as Bishop of Portalegre and, eleven years later, was transferred to the diocese of Vizéu. He died in 1693.

Accession details

Lisbon College closed in 1973 and this collection, along with the rest of the Lisbon Archive and Library, was transferred to Ushaw College by Mgr James Sullivan the following year.

Humphrey Waring (Eliis) for Chapter to President (Barnesley/Perrot): Chapter unanimously approving proposed contract between college and Russell over lease or purchase of a college house situated by the church 1f

LC/P7/2 16 September 1667

Richard Russell (London) to Matthias Watkinson: thanking him for "conclusion" (thesis sheet), expressing surprise in hearing from the president that Watkinson has accepted a Divinity lectureship for only one year, reassuring him and Martin that the clergy have confidence in him, the successor in the Chapter to Mr Powell and proposing J.W. [probably John Williams] so long as he completes his divinity treatise 2f

Richard Russell (at Lisbon) to R. Hesketh (procurator): receipt for 78 mil and 197 res

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: Fisher staying with him, an outbreak of smallpox at the college, his aunt and niece pleased with their relations' entertainment at Portalegre, and advising him to obtain his payment to Mr Holbeck 2f

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: recovery of students from the smallpox outbreak including John Allen and Henry Har[nage], Fisher about to leave, and hoping that the procurator will spend Christmas at Portalegre

Richard Russell (Arronches) to Matthias Watkinson: recounting how he asserted his authority over a troublesome lay official, describing Arronches and the surrounding country including ruined buildings as a result of the war with Spain, and disputes over houses given to the college by Coutinho

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: his success in a dispute with the Conservadores de Malta over clergy's rights, his wish for the procurator's help in his suit with the Conde de Miranda, the death of Gilbert, his ordination of Sylvestre Correa de Sylva as deacon, requiring an English tailor in his household, urging Watkinson to take his degree, his intention to visit Elvas in Easter week, and wishing Antonio Ferreira to know that Portalegre is short of physicians and the need to write to the Prince on the subject 2f

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: Donna Joanna Coutinho willing to look after his niece and teach her language and manners, planning to call on the Conde de Miranda at Apalhao, the Canon Penitentiary about to set off for Lisbon, and the suitability of John Brett's brother as tailor

Richard Russell (at Ponte de Sor) to Matthias Watkinson: Donna Joanna Coutinho's to look after his niece, the Canon Penitentiary's arrival in college, people flocking for confirmation, his hopes about the Parliament, and Reynolds staying with him 2f

Richard Russell (Niza) to Matthias Watkinson: asking him not to starve the Canon Penitentiary, his (Russell's) involvement in contests with friars over episcopal jurisdiction, and asking for prayers of Syon nuns and of students

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: Sylvestre Correa unable to devote the time to preparing the papers for the Monteiro Mor, his hopes in successfully winning the jurisdiction dispute, his belief that episcopal vacancies (occurring while Portugal was trying to

re-establish its independence) have allowed military orders to usurp powers poorly defended by Chapters, his desire to exert his authority if friars go beyond their privileges, his belief that the college will not get a Jesuit Protector, and his offer of a piece of gold for gilding the Lady Altar in the college

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: his displeasure that Wilkinson has not been working on his degree, sending thanks to Donna Joanna de Coutinho, Monteiro Mor appointed president of the Mesa de Consciencia, Wilkinson's query about titles and arms of Lord Almoner, dangerous illnesses in Lisbon, and Fisher may send glazier and tailor 2f

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: informing him that he has sent a procuration to recover the 6,000 crowns and arrangements to pay the procurator 1f

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: the settlement of a matter, Russell's friendship with J. de Almeida, criticism of R. Mestre's conduct, expenses for the Misericordia [?in Portalegre], his letter to Parry [British Ambassador] on the Duke of York and the Lord Treasurer declaring their Catholic allegiance and hoping that he has not offended Parry 1f

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: apologising that letters he sent to Queen [Catharine] via Parry have not arrived, Dr G[?odden's] recall of Mr Edwards, Portalegre's heat wave, his lack of trouble with the Prior of S. lago (belonging to the Knights of Malta); case of possession which Reynolds will describe, and has sent two sacks of flax to his sister (Sr Maria Russell) at Syon

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: Prince wanting Russell to attend Cortes at the college and arrangements for visiting, and his dispute with J. de Almeida and arguing that it is in the interests of the bishops of Portugal to ensure that his *Accordao da Relação* is upheld

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: intending to go via Ponte de Sor to Santarem on the way to Lisbon, Canon Penitentiary accompanying him, unrest among the clergy over Russell's decision to send some for further training, and his wish to obstruct J. de Almeida 2f

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: wanting six Portuguese versions of John of St Thomas's catechism from the Irish Dominicans, John Sergeant being a disciple of Blacklow (White), accusations by G. Leyburne of Blacklowism in the college and subsequent investigations ordered by the Nuncio

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: arrangements for sending letters to England via Charles Watkinson

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: Reynold's illness, Luis Cordeiro's uncle (the Mestre Scholla) being placed under house arrest by Russell's Vicar General (Garro) after disorder at High Mass, and Colonel Naper's illness

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: sending money to pay Watkinson's rent, and wishing to buy a present for Ruy Dias Galliano who entertained him on his visit to Niza 1f

LC/P7/34 30 January 1675

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: no news of the crucifix altar, his plans to start the visitation of the diocese, asking for statement of his account with the college, and informing him that there is now a mediator for the clergy quarrel

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: thanking Wilkinson for sending a cook, and plans to send his third nephew to the college 1f

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: a misunderstanding over Russell's money, his plan to send the Vicar General for a stay in London, expressing surprise that Wilkinson wants Russell to take in an Irishman as his secretary on the recommendation of Sir William Godolphin, Reynolds intending to leave on the Queen's frigate, Fisher leaving college, wine for Lord Baltimore, the death of the archbishop of Evora, and informing him of Donna Leonor de Miranda Enriques going to the Convent of Santa Cruz and hoping to get a divorce 1f

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: Wilkinson getting money for the college, Underhill indispensable, ordinands are welcome guests, Russell's account with Wilkinson 2f

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: the scandalous Bishop of Liria, his (Russell's) servant taking up with a negress slave, and payment of Fisher's travelling expenses 1f

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: Corregidor sending W. Ratcliffe to prison, and sympathy in the diocese towards Russell over the ecclesiastical jurisdiction case 1f

LC/P7/58 14 August 1675

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: Vicar General working hard for the cause and explaining why he told the Vicar General to notify the gaoler, and expecting the arrival of Diniz de Mello who is visiting the frontiers of the province

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: recounting dispute with Provedor and feeling that he (?Russell) has acquitted himself well, and his willingness to forgive the Mestre Scholla if he is repentant

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: his desire to shown no fear which has earned him respect from opponents, and Frank Digby's poor health

LC/P7/61 4 September 1675

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: Watkinson and the Vicar General being tricked by Manoel de Costas into failing to provide evidence which would have proved Mestre Schollas's falsity, the dismissal of his cook for poor behaviour, and asking whether Warner will be returning to England

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: his hopes that the Relaçao may yet see the papers proving Mestre Schollas's falsity, and the abbot's poor health

LC/P7/63 18 September 1675

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: expressing his satisfaction with the outcome of the Vicar Genera's trip, Vicar General and J. Vivas praising the college hospitality, Russell sending Bartolmeo de Carvalho to replace the sick abbot, sending an enclosure to Mesa de Paço over a new dispute, and Dean expecting Fisher to succeed Sergeant as college's agent in England

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: arrangements for sending cloth, payment of Miguel Vieira, Corregidor wishing to start a new dispute with the Vicar General, and an opportunity for his chaplain to go to Italy

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: note sent with Joao Carvalho Raxeiro who brought Russell's cloth to the college

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: Padre Carvalho leaving Italy, seeking cod and cheese, informing him that he has sent the cloths for gowns, and Digby's work 1f

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: the sword, a case of conscience to be solved by the Jesuits, Miguel Vieira writing to the Vicar General requesting *provisões* which are urgently needed, Mr Betts's illness, an increase in Portalegre marriages owing to the King's attempt to raise 251 men from the territory (married men are exempt), and 100 families have left for Spain

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: Brother Francis's relapse, and the poor condition of Syon

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: the death of a student, cloth ready but unable to send it, ready to send his papers for his *Ad limina*, requesting a spherical dial and the sword, and the effect of the death of the Marques de Gouvea on his opponents. This is described as above in the card catalogue but cannot be located.

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: presuming that Carvalho arrived the following day for the defence of conclusions of divinity, business with Colston, and Father Francis's recovery

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: presuming that business with Colston is now complete, Father Francis's recovery, agreeing to send him white cloth for his underclothes, his sister's poor health, and the Vicar General and Sylvestre Correa at Castello de Vide sorting out disputes

LC/P7/72 30 November 1675

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: Carvalho, asking for statement of his account, Ned [Cluer's] progress in Latin, and thanking Mr Edwards for his conclusions 2f

LC/P7/73 25 December 1675

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: officiating at carious ceremonies lasting all night, his worries over the political situation in England and the pressures being brought to bear on the King, intending to visit Arronches for 10 days, and his determination to be firm with the Mestee Scholla

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: Corea and Lopez's sickness, the shortage of corn, and Canon Penitentiary sending his regards to the Revd Prior Diogo Roiz d'Almeida 1f

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: the ruins at Arronches and the state of his home, and Parry praising Christmas entertainment staged by the students at the college 1f

LC/P7/76 29 January 1676

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: commenting on Parry's praise, and the possibility of Mestre Scholla causing further trouble 1f

LC/P7/77 19 February 1676

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: death of Lord Baltimore (member of the Council of the Queen's revenue) and its implications for his (Russell's) allowance from the Queen, asking Watkinson to contact his brother to recover what he can for his pension, his wish

for a crucifix and candlesticks, Colonel Naper worrying over his sons, the death of Maria Aires and the possibility of her daughter going to a convent

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: his decision to accept a Portuguese ordinand (recommended by Antonio Jorge de Mello and a friend of J. Vivas) for Portalegre, complaining about Sergeant and hoping that he will not bring the college into disrepute, advising Watkinson against sending a letter containing propositions drawn up by Perrot, his belief that the college will be able to justify itself, informing him that he will still be getting a pension, the ill heath of Watkinson's mother, the replacement of Waring and Russell's opinion that Perrot is unsuitable for the post, and his hope that Fisher will be appointed as the college's procurator in England

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: a marriage dispensation from the Nuncio, his nephew and Mr Victor's protege to be sent to Portalegre, and his ordination of 28 priests This letter is described as above in the card catalogue but cannot be located 1f

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: commenting on bishop of Martyria, Mestre Scholla, Father Patrick, conversion of Mrs Maynard, sending cloth in return for English cheeses, Mr Carford's pictures, and hearing guns in Lisbon 1f

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: returning Sergeant's censured propositions and his belief that Sergeant will be treat harshly at Rome, his objections to Sergeant's claims to have provided rigorous demonstrations throughout his books, advising Watkinson not to speak out, Parry informing him that the French have defeated the Dutch and Spanish at sea, the acceptance of Mr Ratcliffe's daughter Maricotta at S. Bernardo and Donna Brittis's disappointment

Richard Russell (at Apalhao) to Matthias Watkinson: John Brett selling a mule of Russell's at Lisbon and also conveying money to Diogo Velho, his (Russell's) satisfaction with Brett, and Parry's stay

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: the sale of his mule, Carvalho's expenses, conflict between France and Spain in Flanders, and ignoring a begging letter from Father Francis in Lisbon (Syon)

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: his poor health, the British ambassador in Rome, his belief that it is too late to maintain English predominance in naval commerce and the French may even be allowed into India

Richard Russell to Matthias Watkinson: his opinion as to whether Peter Brook (naval doctor) would be a good doctor for the college, Lawrence's fretfulness, satisfied with his new cook, planning to stay with J. de Vivas at Castello de Vide, and his wish to pay for de Vivas's nephew to go to the college
