Contents

Correspondence between Pedro Coutinho and others, notably Archpriest William Harrison, William Newman, Cardinal Santi, and Archpriest John Coilleton, mostly on the foundation of Lisbon College including the role of the Inquisition, opposition from the Jesuits, the formation of a constitution, and financial difficulties in its early years. The letters also make frequent reference to the wider political situation, including the Spanish marriage [?between Prince Charles and the Infanta] and tensions between England and Holland. Also includes a file of transcriptions (mostly Portuguese with some of the early letters also translated into English).

About the creator

Pedro Coutinho (d. 1638) founded Lisbon College as a seminary for English students training for the priesthood and mission work in England.

Accession details

Lisbon College closed in 1973 and this collection, along with the rest of the Lisbon Archive and Library, was transferred to Ushaw College by Mgr James Sullivan in the following year.

The papers follow the original arrangement of the collection which is broadly chronological.

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to Archpriest William Harrison: Newman reporting the proposal to found a seminary which will be under the authority of the archpriest who will appoint a procurator

LC/P2/2 3 July 1621

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman (Madrid): the amount of rent to be allowed to the proposed college, suggesting that it should be raised to 4,000 crusados, and the view of Domingos de Rosario O.P. that if the college was under the Dominicans the necessary royal permissions would soon be obtained 2f

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman (Madrid): reporting queries about how the seminary is to be supported financially

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman (Madrid): the need for Newman and Thomas More to get the king [Philip IV of Spain] to improve the passage giving jurisdiction over the college to the Inquisitor in order to keep the Jesuits out and to try to obtain the same status as Douai College, the limitation of the Inquisitor's powers, his anger at Jesuit attempts to thwart the college by moving the Valladolid seminary to Lisbon, and suggesting that if Newman wants to return to Lisbon then More can take over his work in Madrid 4f

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman (Madrid): asking for Douai's constitutions, and advising him to appoint a procurator from among the archpriest and the English clergy 2f

LC/P2/6 1 January 1622

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman (Madrid): the royal *provisão* and Douai's constitutions, the urgent need to choose a site and to get the constitutions and privileges from Rome as soon as possible

LC/P2/7 4 January 1622

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman (Madrid): the king [Philip IV of Spain] has signed the *provisão* but he is still awaiting the constitutions, seeking Newman's assistance in Lisbon

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman (Madrid): the need for Newman to return and to decide whether to come to Vila Visosa or stay at court 2f

LC/P2/9 5 June 1622

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman (Madrid): sending a copy of a document asking for the king [Philip IV of Spain's] approval of further privileges for the college, limiting the powers of the Inquisitor, suggesting that Newman and More could act for Coutinho, asking him to send Douai's constitution so that a petition could be made to the Desembargo do Paço for royal approval and to get the king's confessor to relieve them from Jesuit interference, Desembargo's approval of a Douai-style constitution which the pope will need to extend similar privileges, thanking him for More's letters 3f

LC/P2/10 17 April 1623

Letter from John Colleton (archpriest in London) to P. Coutinho: thanking him for his generosity at a time when Hormuz was ruining diplomatic relations between England and Portugal, his opinion that English Catholics should not be blamed for the crimes of heretics, English Catholics to support Coutinho's fleet with their prayers and the establishment of a seminary, his belief that the Spanish marriage [?Prince Charles and the Infanta] will not lead to complete liberty for English Catholics but that the seminary would still be important even if England were to return to the faith

LC/P2/11 1 July 1623

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman: the pain in his hand preventing him from writing, Walter Yates to provide news of progress, Comde de Portalegro's galleons to go in March

This letter is not in Coutinho's hand

LC/P2/12 16 July 1623

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman (Madrid): it will be a great pity if the Spanish marriage [?Prince Charles and the Infanta] does not take place, the Jesuits attempting to change Countinho's mind

Letter from P. Coutinho (Barquerena) to W. Newman (Madrid): taking the waters at Barquerena, asking Newman to be patient 2f

LC/P2/14 27 August 1623

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman: letters not received by Newman, suggesting that the issue should be settled soon, his letter to the bishop, Father Forcer S.J. 2f

LC/P2/15 9 September 1623

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman: his letter to the bishop-elect in England, infoming him that he is still firm in his intention, Dom Menrique, the Spanish marriage [?Prince Charles and the Infanta]

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman: his ill health, entrusting more crusados to Walter Yates, still working towards the seminary 2f

LC/P2/17 21 October 1623

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman: his firmness of intention, sending 50 crusados

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman: the royal wedding, giving instructions to Walter Yates

LC/P2/19 16 December 1623

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman: the royal wedding, his illness, wishing to see England, Walter Yates will provide him with more news 2f

LC/P2/20 13 January 1624

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman: disturbances over England and Holland, asking him not to lose hope over the seminary as Coutinho is still firm in his intentions in spite of opposition

Letter from P. Coutinho to Father General of S. Carlo: purchasing property belonging to a monastery for the proposed seminary

LC/P2/22 28 January 1629

Letter from P. Coutinho (Madrid) to W. Newman (Lisbon): informing him that he has sent the rules and Fr Edward (Missenden) has sent the corrected copy, the joyful atmosphere in the palace over the peace with England, Coutinho's appointment as a Counsellor of State

LC/P2/23 12 February 1629

Letter from P. Coutinho (Madrid) to W. Newman: he will consult his own interests if the bishop does not keep promises, asking him not to mention his name at the opening of the schools, silks to be used for vestments, attempts to get permission to leave Madrid, Joseph Harvey's difficulties

LC/P2/24 23 February 1629

Letter from P. Coutinho (Madrid) to W. Newman: trying to obtain permission to leave, planning to relieve Newman of his burden, asking him to obtain money from England for property, silks for vestments, a report of Dutch ships

Includes a copy of a receipt by Newman for 7,646 reis delivered by Walter Yates to pay for students

Letter from P. Coutinho (Madrid) to W. Newman: still trying to obtain permission for leave, silks for vestments, the opening of the schools

LC/P2/26 10 March 1629

Letter from P. Coutinho (Madrid) to W. Newman: he will send someone over to take over from Newman, seeking his advice, the ships for India are ready

Not in Coutinho's hand

LC/P2/27 10 March 1629

Letter from P. Coutinho (Madrid) to W. Newman: his worries over the seminary as he is forced to stay in Madrid, sorry to hear of the president's death, his difficulties in governing the seminary from Madrid, his belief that Yates should pay the 250 milres to whomever becomes president, advising him to act as president or make Mailer president, seeing difficulties in Newman going to England, Yates will pay Newman's expenses on Coutinho's business

Letter from P. Coutinho (Madrid) to W. Newman: his view that God does not favour the new seminary, the need for Newman to remedy matters while Coutinho is forced to stay in Madrid

LC/P2/29 26 March 1629

Letter from P. Coutinho (Madrid) to W. Newman: the quarrel with Walter Yates, his anger that the college is going so badly and that those in England do not care, asking Yates to pay the 250 milres p.a., informing him that there has been no order from England to buy property, Yates's inability to apply Countinho's money except for living expenses of the college, advising him to look after the seminary and not to let the students go out too much Not in Coutinho's hand

Letter from P. Coutinho (Madrid) to W. Newman: planning to resolve the disagreement with Yates over the college accounts when he returns, planning to set off for home shortly, report of peace with England and Holland, hoping that everything will work out if England keeps its promises

Letter from P. Coutinho (Lisbon) to W. Newman: ships leaving for India, his lack of hope for success, money for a sanctuary lamp and a petition connected with it 2f
